



SPINES AND CAPACITY

When talking about ring binders there's always one topic that gets us all thoroughly mixed up, hot under the collar and generally Confused.com. What's the difference between spine size and capacity and which is most important?

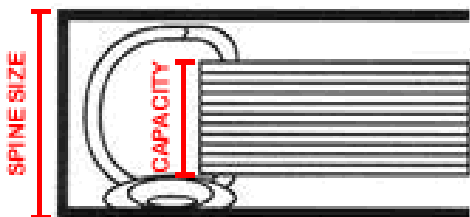
Spine Size

This is literally the width of the spine of the ring binder. This means that this dimension relates to how much room the binder will take up on your shelf.

Capacity

This is the depth of paper that is recommended for your chosen mechanism.

So, a 25mm capacity ring binder will have a 38mm spine width (and take up 38mm of shelf space), but should be optimum for holding a stack of paper 25mm thick (or 200 sheets of 120gsm paper).



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
